REPORT ON JOB FAIR



The Placement Cell conducted an on campus Job Fair in collaboration with Asgardia Foundation & Magic Bus India Foundation on the 24th of November, 2021. The program started at 9.00 A.M. with the students assembling in Bhagwan Mahaveer Gyan Bhawan for the process of registration. As the registrations were progressing a welcome address was given to the students by Ms. Malini Jain. S, Dr. Murali, and the HRs from few of the companies who had assembled for the job fair. A total of 1523 students, from our college, as well as other colleges participated in the job fair. A total of 1038 students from our college, both the current and passed out students had registered for the job drive.

The students were given opportunity to attend more than one company of their likings, with some even attending the interviews of up to five companies. A total of 400 plus students were given either offer letters or intent letters from the companies. Few of the companies have more interview process before granting job offers.

“THE FALL OF AFGHAN GOVERNMENT AND ITS IMPLICATIONS FOR INDIA”

The Department of Defence and Strategic Studies of Agurchand Manmull Jain College Shift II conducted a webinar titled “The Fall of Afghan Government and Its implications For India” on 17th September 2021. The Department invited Dr. Utham Kumar Jamadhagni Professor and Head, Dept. of Defence and Strategic Studies University of Madras as the speaker for the webinar. The program began with an invocation with the Jain Maha mantra followed by Thamizh Thaaai Vaazhthu. The welcome address and introduction of chief guest was done by Dr. Rinchowon Duidang.

The chief guest in his speech stated that, to understand the crisis which is prevailing in today's Afghanistan, we must first understand the cold war era of Soviet invasion. Indian and Afghanistan ties prevails since the ancient period. After the soviet defeat and retreat in 1990 Afghanistan again descended into civil war. In 1996 Taliban Succeeded and

ruled the country till 2001. When 9/11 attack happened in 2001 terrorist those who planned and executed the 9/11 were hiding in Afghanistan. In 2001 USA declared war on terror and invaded Afghanistan and in 2021 America decided to pull back its troops from Afghan. This sudden withdrawal paved the way for Taliban to recapture power in 2021. The interim government formed by Taliban mostly consist of leaders those who have been designat-ed as Global terrorists. Speaking on the Implications for India, he said that India can come up with its own policy and a diplomatic engagement can be extended. The speaker Completed the session with pertinent answers to the various questions put forth by the students. Mr.D.Dhayanand Coordinator delivered the vote of thanks. 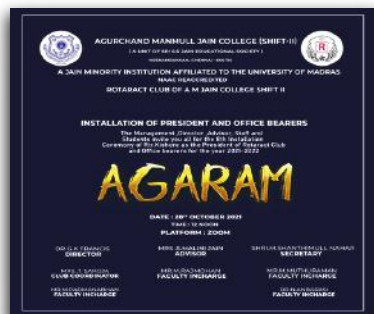
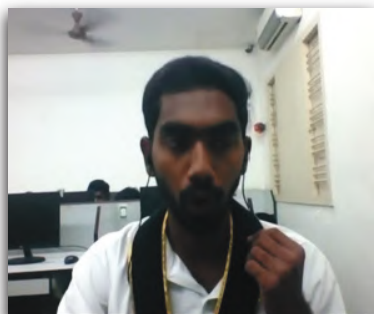

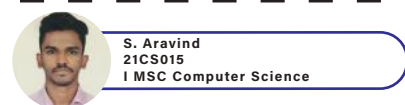

What is a Full Stack Developer?

Full stack developer is the one who can develop Front end, Back end & Database. A web development process includes the following three layers:



1. The Presentation Layer
2. The Business Layer
3. The Database Layer



- The Presentation layer is also called the Frontend layer and this deals with the end-users directly.

- The Business Layer is also called the Back-end layer and this deals with process of application development which doesn't involve the user interface.

- The Database Layer tells how the data are read, created, updated and deleted using databases like SQL, MySQL, Oracle, MongoDB.

Front - End Development

The Front-End is a Client Side of the application which refers to the interface that we see on the website. Some of the Front-end technologies are HTML, CSS, Java Script.

Back - End Development

The Back-End is a Server Side of the website. Some of the Back-End technologies are Python, Java, Apache, Ruby.
