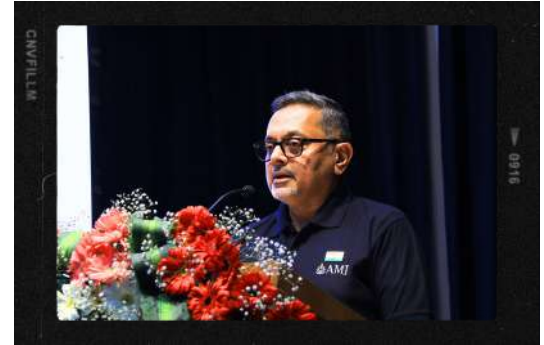

The main objective of this Inter-collegiate competition was to upgrade the trending knowledge in the field of IT sector by conducting Technical activities for the students among various colleges.

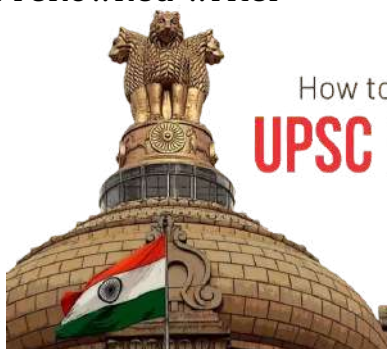

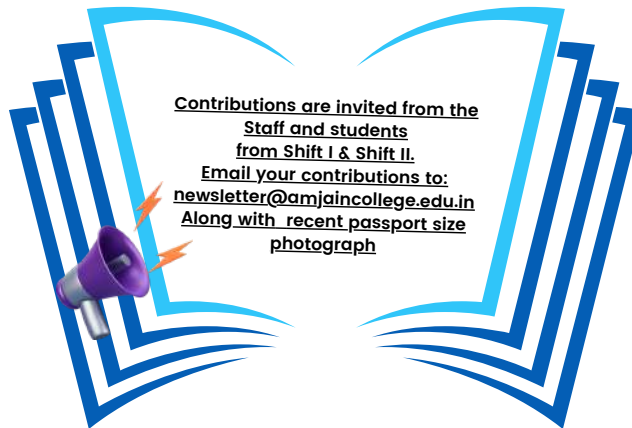
